





- US 14 - Lexington Drive Intersection Construction














Construction Staging 2016 (Mar. – Aug.)




Construction Staging 2016-2017




US 14 – WIS 26 Ramp Closure Detour







Stay informed

- Meet the on-site project manager – keep his/her telephone number in a handy place.
- Attend WisDOT's public meetings to increase your knowledge of the project.



Stay informed

- Hold a pre-construction meeting with WisDOT and the contractor.
 - Find out the duration of the project, construction staging, etc.
 - Learn what to expect (i.e., dirt, mud, ground shaking, etc.)
- Participate in project update meetings.



Tips

- Get involved early. Advanced planning and organization pays off.
- Form an alliance with other businesses in your area.



Tips

- Pool resources to purchase group advertising.

ROAD WORK AHEAD

Project Details

The project contains three segments: a northern segment between WIS 64 and just north of Aeri's Way, a southern segment extending to Perkins St., and a middle segment between Perkins Street and WIS 64.

The northern and southern segments include new concrete curb and gutter, pavement replacement, new storm, sanitary sewer and water lines. The northern segment will be expanded to a five lane roadway with the middle lane roadway with the middle southern segment will remain a three lane roadway with the middle lane used for left turns. In the middle segment, city utilities will be installed and repaired. Roundabouts will replace traffic signals at Allman Street and Aeri Way.

New sidewalks will be installed on both sides of WIS 45 from WIS 64 to Aeri's Way and new street lighting will be located on both sides of WIS 13 throughout the northern segment.

The first segment detour will be Cty. O, Cty. Q and Hwy 64 with access to local businesses down Wholen Ave.
 Target date to complete 1st segment is July 4th, 2011.

Sponsorship Program

In July 2012, WisDOT initiated the State Highway Maintenance and Operations Sponsorship Program as an innovative source of financing for maintenance and highway-related services.

Program overview

Provide opportunities to meet state highway service expectations that have either:

- Become unsustainable due to budget limitations;

- OR -

- As a result of other demands for services that exceed the funded service level.

Program benefits

- Recognition will be offered to a person, business or other entity for monetary contribution to the maintenance of highway roadsides.
- Sponsors will receive recognition with their logos displayed on acknowledgement signs.



Program benefits

- Highway segments will receive an increased level of roadside maintenance.
- State Statute Chapter 84.01(36) outlines the sponsorship agreement details.

Program reminders

- Maintenance agreements still need to be in place for roundabouts and park and ride lots.
- Sponsorship is an opportunity that can be utilized by the local unit of government to offset the costs of maintenance.

Program reminders

- A sponsor CAN NOT replace a maintenance agreement.
- Roadside maintenance sponsors would be directly with WisDOT because we have agreements with the Counties to maintain these areas.

Roadside Sponsorship Program

The Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) initiated the State Highway Maintenance and Operations Sponsorship Program as an innovative source of financing for maintenance and highway-related services. The Roadside Sponsorship Program is part of this initiative. The program is intended to provide opportunities to meet state highway service expectations that have either become unsustainable due to budget limitations or as a result of other demands for services that exceed the funded service level.

- Recognition will be offered to a person, business or other entity for monetary contribution to the maintenance of highway roadsides.
- Sponsors will receive recognition with their logos displayed on acknowledgement signs.
- Highway segments will receive an increased level of roadside maintenance.
- State Statute [Chapter 84.01\(36\)](#) outlines the sponsorship agreement details.

General sponsor guidelines

- Complete and submit the [Proposal Form \(DT1210\)](#).
- A minimum proposal will be determined on a site by site basis.
- The proposals will be opened on the identified date of opening.
- The most advantageous competitive proposal as determined by the department will be awarded the contract. The department may reject all proposals if the submittals are determined to be less than the estimated reasonable value to the department or not in the public interest.
- The awarded contracts will be in place for a minimum of two years.
- Each sponsor will receive two acknowledgement signs: one in each direction of travel, placed near each end of the segment.
- The sign will show your logo. Sign size is 4 x 6 feet and logo area is 2 x 4 feet.
- Final logos will be approved by the Department. No website addresses and phone numbers are allowed, per The Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD).
- The sponsor agreement will begin after first payment and acknowledgement signs are installed.
- WisDOT will use existing service providers to provide the services for the Roadside Sponsorship Program. The service providers include county highway departments and local municipalities.
