Discussion:

1. Welcome and introduction.

Vincent provided an overview of the agenda.

- 2. Vincent presented on the DWD apprenticeship report. Vincent presented the Rock County Apprentice Snapshot handouts from DWD. Information covered data on minority and women apprentice for the month of April.
- 3. Kim provided SW Mega I39/I90 Expansion Updates.
 - Handouts were provided including the 2016 Construction Guide and updated construction project maps.
 - \$95.8 million in contingent bonding was approved In November 2015.
 - Number of statewide lettings with savings made it possible for I-39/90 to advance \$22.9 million of work, and the next lets will be May 10 and June 14.
 - There will be construction projects going on to 2022.
- 4. Bill wanted to know the percentage of construction that will be completed by end of year 2016. Kim said approximately a 3rd of the entire budget. DBE commitments and payments are being tracked and a head count is being reported to the DBE office for tracking.

Post meeting update: The actual amount of construction dollars spent or that are committed to spend on active projects (includes Rock River Bridges to be completed in 2018) is approximately 20%. The entire project (design, real estate, utilities and construction) has committed about 26% of the total budget.

- 5. Crystal & Julie provided shared the following activities:
 - Reached out to the Beloit Chamber of Commerce.
 - Reached out to local colleges.
 - Reaching out to women and minority owned business within Rock County.
 - Recruiting efforts to hire a college intern to compile data for Rock County.
- 6. Bill D. discuss a new program called Destination Career Academy being implemented in local schools.



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- The program was started through Destination K12 where high school students are offered classes needed to become an operating engineer.
- Classes begin with OSHA and federal regulations which can be completed at home or in school.
- According to Bill this program gives students a leg up with entering into the apprenticeship program.
- According to Bill this is the first such program in the nation offering this type of opportunity.
- Bill also mentioned Operating Engineers involves veterans and there are currently 40 veterans as operating engineers.

- 7. Vincent asked the group if they had any suggestions for further DBE outreach in Rock County.
 - Lynn just received a grant with the Transportation Fund, they also have a welding boot camp with Workforce Development Board and would like to discuss further opportunities.
 - Rock Roads advised DOT to contact established business that have experience in larger construction projects.

Action Needed: Crystal will meet with Lynn Jones to discuss future work opportunities, and follow up with Rock Roads to see they have a list of business that could potentially be DBE Certified.

- 8. Jenna presented the Geographical Analysis Report.
 - Report showed the percentage of female and minority apprentice within the various local zip codes.
 - Jenna went over the Mega project Workforce Utilization Head Count Report, and also provided a breakdown of ethnicity and gender for Heavy equipment operators, laborers, and electricians.
 - Group asked if there was a way to track apprentice to journeymen status once they complete the apprenticeship program.
 - Jenna advised no solid information but speculates from her conversation with businesses that apprentices may move on to building construction instead of heavy highway work.
- 9. Jenna and Jennifer provided the TrANS update.
 - Reports will be changing from bimonthly to quarterly.
 - The current report is always ran one month behind, and the totals are for Jan-March 2016.
 - Jennifer reported on the screening process and the number of orientations held at Community Action.
 - There has been a lot of outreach to companies informing them of the TrANS program and providing them with resumes of the TrANS graduates.
 - Fahrner and Hoffman hired TrANS grads and this information will be on the May and June report.
- 10. Group discussion regarding CDL testing:
 - Forward Services explained different test options for various CDL license.
 - Rock Road has been supportive of CDL training efforts.
 - Sue advised that if they see drivers with potential they may encourage apprentice to explore future ownership possibilities.
 - Forward Service is handing out flyers for upcoming classes at the Aberg Job Center as well as other community organizations.
 - Forward Services will be reaching out to high schools, probation and parole officers to inform them of upcoming events to spark participants for the screening.
- 11. Vincent provided the calendar for projects being let this information is also available on the HCCI website.
