1. Labor Group Meeting (5 P.M.)
Welcome and Opening Remarks

The group was welcomed by Rochelle and brief introductions were given.

Michele discussed the following:

- a. Introduced the handouts that will be discussed including the agenda, purpose and goals, and the labor fact sheet.
- b. Explained the labor group should come up with an aspirational goal. She suggested discussing what labor information/statistics are already available from the group members and creating a unified labor message. This should take two to three meetings and there is a data collection exercise included.

Michele discussed the aspirational goals sheet and labor goal setting process handout:

- a. Debunk the myth there are no qualified minorities or women to do construction work.
- b. Maximize what WisDOT can bring to the table.

- c. Focus on those who are affected by the project area. Important to look at population affected and look at unemployment.
- d. Get the neighborhood involved in training for potential employment in the project area. Joe reminded the group that contractors determine which project to locate their workforce; therefore, locally trained workers may not work on local projects.

Michele provided guidance on the process as follows:

- a. Identify resources.
- b. Share concepts.
- c. Review union job descriptions.
- d. Identify how resources fit within the WisDOT process.
- e. Identify how to reach people/applicants who can use the information for employment.
- f. Once a pool of applicants is identified, get them involved in the proper training programs to have them “ready, willing, and able” for the upcoming projects.
- g. Begin to fill in the chart on page three of the aspirational goals handout. Mary said Operation Fresh Start can provide some numbers for the chart. Michele asked if other groups could assist? Mary said she can gather information from the groups included in CWDA. Michele requested Mary identify the various groups within the CWDA that could assist this labor group. Michele reminded the group the goal is to gather information and then know how to access the information when needed.
- h. Michele said she would like to be able to have accurate information in the chart on page 3 by the end of the next meeting in March. She requested the labor group members come to the March meeting prepared to fill in the chart.
- i. Michele asked whether any additions are needed to the chart? Marge suggested adding the Diesel Truck Driving School near Sun Prairie and the Blackhawk Technical College. Marge also said she will identify schools that have a formal construction program and get contact information from them. She suggested that Jim Cook provide demographics for the diploma program at MATC. Jim agreed to provide the information for the March meeting.
- j. Paul Zimmer agreed to gather union information for the chart for use at the March meeting.
- k. Michele said that WisDOT will gather data for step three on page 2 for the March meeting.

Rochelle will update the chart on page 3 with the additions suggested to allow the group to fill the chart at the March meeting.

1. Michele summarized the Labor Group meeting by requesting the information gathering discussed tonight be completed for use at the March meeting. The goal of the March meeting will be to complete the chart on page 3.

2. Project Updates

Joe Bunker provided project updates as follows:

 - a. Verona Road Project, Stage 1, Phase 1 (Beltline area):
 - (1) Project let May 14, 2013. The project is anticipated to start construction in July 2013 and be completed by July 2014.
 - (2) Joe explained the various elements of the Stage 1, Phase 1 work.
 - b. Verona Road Project Stage 1, Phase 2 (Beltline area):
 - (1) Project let July 2014. The project is anticipated to start in September 2014 and be completed by the fall of 2016.
 - (2) Joe explained the various elements of the Stage 1, Phase 2 work.
 - c. Verona Road project Stage 2 (CTH PD)
 - (1) Construction anticipated to take place between 2017 to 2019.
 - (2) Joe noted the project website: www.veronaroadproject.wi.gov
 - d. I-39 Project (Madison to the State Line)
 - (1) The project will expand the interstate from 4 lanes to 6 lanes (8 lanes through Janesville).
 - (2) The project will start in 2013 and extend through 2020.
 - (3) Joe explained the various elements of the project including concrete paving, asphalt paving, base course, bridges, restoration, traffic cameras, traffic control and pavement marking.

Rochelle said it would be helpful to the group to have a project manager from the I-39 project available to attend the next meeting. Katrina stated she would talk with a project manager from the project.

Katrina will contact a project manager from the I-39 project about attending the next meeting.

3. Business Group Meeting (6:15 P.M.)

Welcome and Opening Remarks

The group was welcomed by Rochelle and brief introductions were given.

Michele discussed the following goals of the group:

- a. Discuss contracting goals for Disadvantaged Business Enterprises (DBEs).
- b. Identify linkages to minority and women owned businesses that are doing construction work.
- c. Consider ways to help firms expand their business.
- d. Michele supplied the group with a listing of 71 DBE firms in WisDOT's

SW region. She noted that 38 of the firms are consulting firms. Of the remaining 33 firms, 8 firms are construction-oriented, 9 are trucking-oriented, 10 perform residential construction, and 6 are suppliers. Female Caucasians own 47 of the 71, Blacks own 9 of the 71, Hispanic own 7 of the 71, Native Americans own 5 of the 71, and Pacific Islanders own 7 of the 71.

- e. Michele asked the group to review the listing of firms and provide additions to the listing at the March meeting. The group will review the DBE listing for additions by the March meeting.
- f. Norman Davis provided three names of businesses to add to the listing including Urban Construction Administration, Hairston Trucking, Blair Landscaping and an environmental firm. Norman will e-mail Rochelle with the names and contact information for these groups prior to the March meeting. Norman will provide names and contacts for the businesses he identified.
- g. Julie asked how many counties are included in the listing of firms? Michele stated the firms are from the entire SW Region.
- h. Julie said many general contractors are not willing to deal with the paperwork requirements to become DBE-certified.
- i. Michele suggested inviting firms identified by the group to these meetings to provide them information about the potential business opportunities and how this group can help them. Michele asked Norm to send an invite to these meetings to those he mentioned. Norm will send an invite to the firms he feels could benefit from attending these meetings.
- j. Michele requested the WisDOT project team schedule orientations for interested DBEs regarding the Verona Road and I-39 projects and provide project specific information during the orientations. Katrina will talk with WisDOT project leaders about possible orientations for the projects.
- k. Al Studesville suggested that Al Toon's company be added to the list of DBE firms to contact. Michele requested Al provide the name and contact information for the business. Al Studesville will provide business information for Al Toon's business.
- l. Al Studesville said that Chamberlain Research is out of business and should be removed from list.
- m. Michele requested the DBE firm listing be updated for review at the next meeting. She would like to use the listing to invite DBE firms to the April prebid meeting for the Verona Road project. Rochelle will update the listing of businesses based on comments received tonight for review at the next meeting.
- n. Michele requested the group review the sample DBE fact sheet handout. She would like the project teams to prepare project-specific fact sheets to provide to DBE firms. She suggested adding the duration of the project in place of "when will construction start."
- o. Michele requested possible dollar amounts be provided for the various work categories (e.g., earthwork, pavement) within the fact sheet. Joe Bunker said providing possible dollar amounts for the various categories

may be against WisDOT's policy to maintain the privacy of project estimates. Michele said she will discuss this with the project teams.

- p. Michele asked whether item number four should have the goals updated? Alicia suggested the goals remain the same.
- q. Norm asked who the intended audience is for the fact sheet and how that audience will receive the sheet? Michele said WisDOT's goal of the fact sheet is to concisely describe project opportunities and obligations. Julie felt providing a one-page fact sheet to DBE contractors could be improved to make it a page of "things to know" and add references for DBE firms. Michele felt a combination of the current items and things to know may be useful.
- r. Michele asked for comments on number five. There were no comments or revisions provided.
- s. Michele asked for comments on number six. Norm suggested keeping number six so small businesses can plan for cash flow.
- t. Michele asked whether any information was missing from the list? Julie suggested a place be provided where people can get help and support on questions.
- u. Michele stated the DBE office will customize the fact sheet for review and use at the next meeting

The DBE office will provide a customized fact sheet for the next meeting.

ASPIRATIONAL LABOR GOAL SETTING

Concept

This exercise should debunk the myth that there are “no qualified workers of color or female gender” in the area and provide the appropriate sources for contractors to address the workforce diversity expectations of the community.

Wisconsin DOT seeks the input of the communities impacted by the project regarding existing, effective workforce development and skill-enhancement resources to quantify a realistic pool of ready, willing and able workers. The goal is maximize WisDOT’s project contribution by acknowledging and leveraging community resources.

Framing Considerations

Population percentages for the area impacted by the mega project and the local area will be the baseline or maximum percentage expressed in the aspirational goal. Baseline data will be gathered for the following:

- » Overall population numbers
- » Minority percentage
- » Female percentage
- » Unemployment percentages for affected area and local area
- » Existing workforce currently employed by contractors

Process

- A. Identify resources share concept/components of their programs
 - a. Compare program components with road construction industry needs
 - b. WisDOT compares program/resource components curriculum with TrANS components
- B. Request count of graduates or eligible candidates from program or resource
 - a. Are potential candidates accessible?
 - b. What are the demographics of the candidates?
 - c. Number accessible candidates constitutes the existing pool of RWA workers
- C. Implement training resources based on information collected
 - a. This list of people are invited to participate in the area’s TrANS program
 - b. WisDOT directs TrANS provider to conduct training based on program/skill compatibility factors
 - o standard course curriculum or modified curriculum

Assertion

Information gathering will be done in order to calculate the minority and female percentage expectations for areas affected most by the mega-project. The mega project Labor Development Sub-Committee reserves the right to adjust (plus or minus) the expectations based on gathered data and additional relevant factors.

Instructions for Calculating Labor Aspirational Goals on Mega-Projects

Step 1: Identify work elements and their corresponding categories

- Project staff and/or Design consultant provide worker classifications
- WisDOT Economist provides labor projections and/or work hours

Step 2: Determine existing pool of ready, willing, able workforce from community sources

- Number of **minority** ready, willing and able workers for mega-project
- Number of **female** ready, willing and able workers for mega-project
- Number of **majority** ready, willing and able workers for mega-project

Step 3: Determine maximum need for 'protected class' workers on mega project based on potential new hires

- Review contractor's who historically win contracts in the area/region
- Are there other contractors that may compete for contracts generated by mega
 - ⇒ Review "As Read/Apparent Bid Results" List
 - ⇒ Review Sign In Sheets from Pre-bid meeting attendees
- Ascertain contractor's existing workforce
 - ⇒ Query contractors
 - ⇒ Guesstimate likelihood for new hires (percentage/ratio)

Step 4: Determination adjustment factor between project-generated need and formal industry resources; ensuring consideration for dislocated, laid-off workers

- Union bench
- Apprenticeship lists
 - ⇒ membership female population in area affected most by mega-project
 - ⇒ membership minority male population in area affected most by mega-project
- Unemployment rate in mega-project affected area

Step 5: Document name, skill set, contact information of the RWA workers into a database housed and maintained at WisDOT.

- ✓ Maintain a list of the sources that provided the aforementioned list for distribution as a Contractor's List of Contacts for Qualified Workers
- ✓ Document the training programs that produced the RWA candidates in a database for consideration as acceptable trainings eligible for ASP 1 goals
- ✓ Track the number of interested candidates and the reason they are not qualified for referral and analysis in the employment & training arena


