Discussion:

1. Welcome and introductions. Joe provided the group with the entry code for viewing the electronic documents.

Rochelle provided an overview of the agenda.

2. Michele presented the labor meeting handouts.
 - a. Michele discussed the priorities table. She presented the five priorities identified in the table along with the goals of each priority. The group agreed that the priorities remain the same for the group. Julie suggested adding the YWCA to the listing of training programs for priority 1.
 - b. Michele presented the WTBA summary of bids exhibit from March 11, 2014. Michele pointed out projects in the Dane County area and the information on the exhibit. She indicated which projects have workforce hiring goals. Jay said the projects receiving federal funding are indicated on the exhibit by the code WISC.

Michelle indicated that at a recent gathering in Madison the Mayor pledged support for workforce opportunities for the Edgewater Hotel project in the City. She indicated that workforce opportunities have momentum in Madison and Dane County at the current time and Mary and Clay agreed.

- c. Michele presented the I-39/90 and Verona Road project schedule exhibit. She indicated the Verona Road contractor, Hoffman Construction, recently contacted the DBE office requesting four flaggers. They were interested in workers from the area based on discussions with local public leader Dorothy Krause. The DBE office continues to work with Hoffman on the request for the

flaggers. Both Julie and Mary stated they have workers available to accommodate the DBE office with the request.

- d. Michele presented the two Southwest Area Construction Apprentice Snapshot exhibits. Clay and Debbie agreed the information on the exhibits was representative of the trades.
 - e. Michele presented the I-39/90, Verona Road Workforce Utilization Report exhibit. Clay commented that apprentices appear to be underutilized on WisDOT projects. Michele stated the DBE office would look into this observation and may have a contractor comment on this issue.
 - f. Michele provided an update on the TrANS program provider. She stated that Forward Alliance won the contract as the next TrANS provider. The DBE office anticipates having Forward Alliance under contract to begin providing services within the next couple months. Clay commented that the TrANS provider for Dane County has been an outstanding issue for quite some time and appears to be missing opportunities for the projects that have been discussed by this group for the past few years and he hopes the issue is resolved soon. Michele stated WisDOT's southeast region TrANS provider has been assisting the DBE office with the southwest region (Dane County) topics.
3. Katrina provided a summary of the I-39/90 projects that will begin construction in 2014 and indicated which projects will include the workforce opportunities specification.
4. Rochelle asked the group how often it would like to continue meeting. Several group members requested fewer meetings. The group agreed to meet again June 4, 2014, and then possibly consider bimonthly meetings.

The DBE office will review the use of apprentices on WisDOT projects.

The meeting adjourned at approximately 6:45 P.M.


The workshop participants will at a minimum:
