1. Welcome and introductions.

Michele provided an overview of the agenda.

2. Michele presented the labor meeting handouts.

- a. Michele discussed the two-page Mega project utilization report handout. She then discussed the Southwest Area Construction Apprenticeship Snapshot. Debbie said the DWD has recently registered new carpenters. Andrea said more laborer apprentices are also going to be available. Clay said the electrical union is also placing more apprentices. Joe shared the TrANS graduate and apprentice hours that are included in the recent Verona Road project letting.
- b. Michele introduced Brian Covey as the new TrANS provider for WisDOT's Southwest Region. Brian presented the two pages of handouts for the Forward Service Corporation. Brian fielded several questions regarding the handouts.
- c. Michele said Dorothy asked a question before the meeting regarding union rules and contractor policy that seems to make it difficult to establish a labor pool of local workers that contractors can use informally. Michele said that Brian could assist with this as the new TrANS provider. Paul and Joe also noted that workers for road construction companies are typically not local and not on the same project all season, as they are

d. Mary Watrud said that CTI-START is working with five other partners to share a worker resource pool.

e. The labor meeting ended at approximately 6:10 P.M. Paul asked what frequency these meetings would continue in the future. The group agreed to meet quarterly with the next meeting in either December or early 2015.

3. Katrina provided a summary of the I-39/90 projects that will begin construction in 2014 and 2015 and indicated which projects will include the workforce opportunities.

4. The business group meeting began at 6:25 P.M. Norman Davis and Alicia Griffin attended the meeting by phone. Brian, Jay, Michele, Vincent, and Joe attended in person.

Michele and Norman discussed some City of Madison projects, such as the Edgewater Hotel project, that are using DBE resources. Norman also mentioned that the City developed a neutral remedy report of targeted businesses that he will share with Michele.

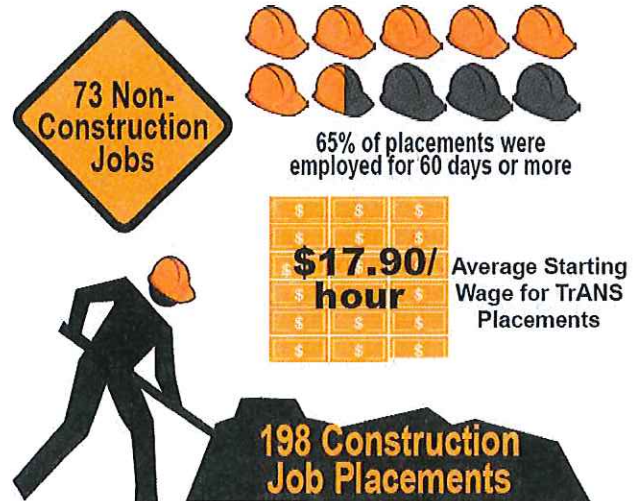

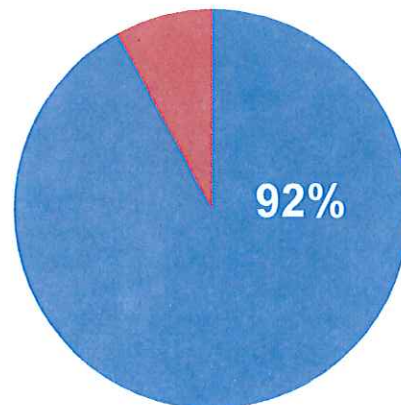

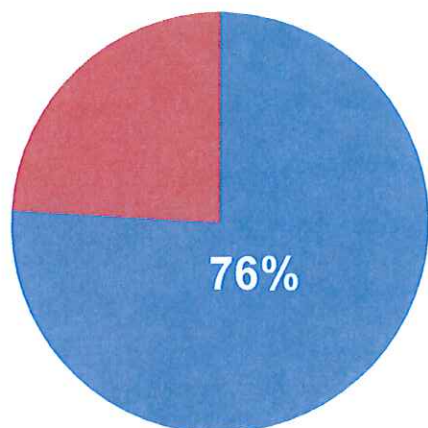


2013-14 TrANS Placement Rate
