INTRODUCTION

The Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) is underway with reconstructing 14 miles of the I-43 North-South Corridor, from Silver Spring Drive north to WIS 60, in Milwaukee and Ozaukee counties. The project is broken into five segments (North End, County Line Road/Port Washington Road Interchange, South End, Mequon Road Interchange, and Port Washington Road).

This project includes the expansion of I-43 from four to six lanes, the reconstruction of five existing interchanges along the corridor, a new interchange at Highland Road, and the replacement of the Union Pacific railroad bridge over I-43 in Glendale. The project also includes the expansion of Port Washington Road, between Bender and Daphne roads, from two lanes to four lanes. I-43 North-South is scheduled to remain open to two lanes, in each direction, during peak travel times.

IMPORTANCE


The I-43 North-South Freeway is among the busiest routes in Wisconsin and is a critical Interstate link between southeast Wisconsin and the entire state. I-43 provides access to manufacturers, merchants, commuters and tourists within southeast Wisconsin, the Milwaukee metropolitan area, and other areas including Green Bay, Sheboygan, Manitowoc, and Chicago.


SCHEDULE



NORTH END SEGMENT:

Between Highland Road and WIS 60 (Washington Street)



 Falls Road, between County W (Port Washington Road) and the Union Pacific Railroad, is scheduled to reopen in late fall.



Lakefield Road, between County W
(Port Washington Road) and
Canterbury Drive, is scheduled to reopen
in late fall.




3. Highland Road, between County W (Port Washington Road) and Lake Shore Drive, reopened to traffic in early October.

The new Highland Road interchange ramps are scheduled to **open by early December**.

COUNTY LINE ROAD/PORT WASHINGTON ROAD SEGMENT:

Between WIS 100 (Brown Deer Road) and Donges Bay Road



4. Donges Bay Road, between County W (Port Washington Road) and just east of La Cresta Drive, reopened in late September.



 Port Washington Road, between Port Washington Lane and County Line Road, is scheduled to remain closed through late 2022.

Katherine Drive, north of Port Washington Road, is scheduled to **remain closed through late fall.**



6. County Line Road entrance ramp to I-43 SOUTH to remain closed through mid-2023.



7. I-43 NORTH exit to Port Washington Road to remain closed through mid-2023.
