INTRODUCTION

The Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) is underway with reconstructing 14 miles of the I-43 North-South Corridor, from Silver Spring Drive north to WIS 60, in Milwaukee and Ozaukee counties. The project is broken into five segments (North End, Mequon Road Interchange, County Line Road/Port Washington Road Interchange, South End, and Port Washington Road).

This project includes the expansion of I-43 from four to six lanes, the reconstruction of five existing interchanges along the corridor, a new interchange at Highland Road, and the replacement of the Union Pacific railroad bridge over I-43 in Glendale. The project also includes the expansion of Port Washington Road, between Bender and Daphne roads, from two lanes to four lanes. I-43 North-South is scheduled to remain open to two lanes, in each direction, during peak travel times.

IMPORTANCE

The I-43 North-South Freeway is among the busiest routes in Wisconsin and is a critical interstate link between southeast Wisconsin and the entire state. I-43 provides access to manufacturers, merchants, commuters and tourists within southeast Wisconsin, the Milwaukee metropolitan area, and other areas including Green Bay, Sheboygan, Manitowoc, and Chicago.

TRAFFIC IMPACTS

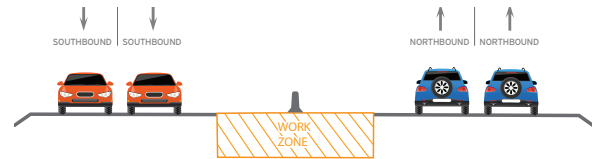

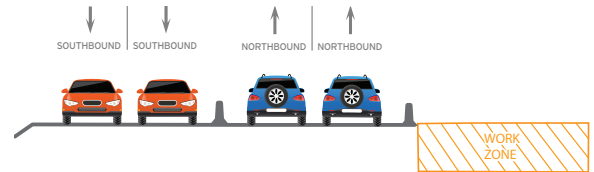


NORTH END SEGMENT - BETWEEN HIGHLAND ROAD AND WIS 60 (WASHINGTON STREET)

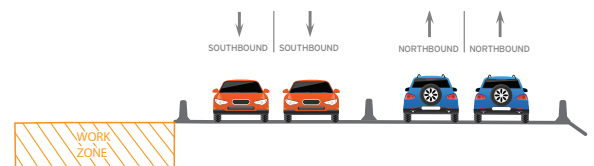

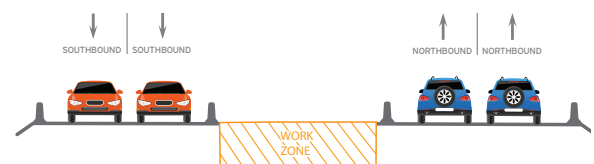
MEQUON ROAD INTERCHANGE SEGMENT - BETWEEN DONGES BAY ROAD AND GLEN OAKS LANE

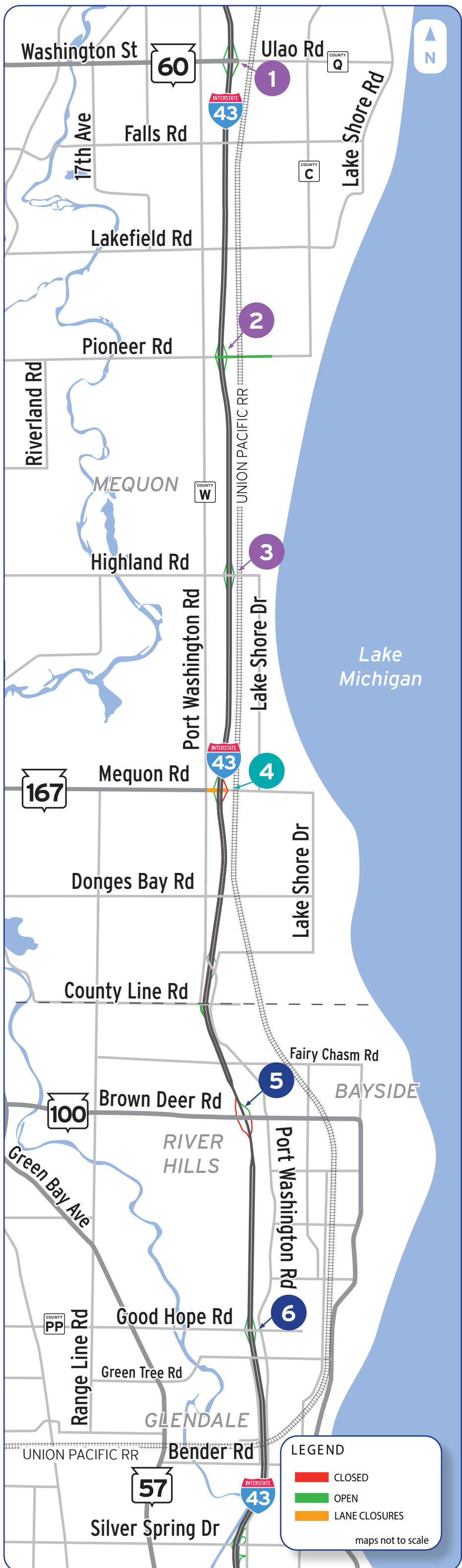


SOUTH END SEGMENT - BETWEEN CALUMET ROAD AND FAIRY CHASM ROAD



SOUTH END SEGMENT - BETWEEN SILVER SPRING DRIVE AND CALUMET ROAD





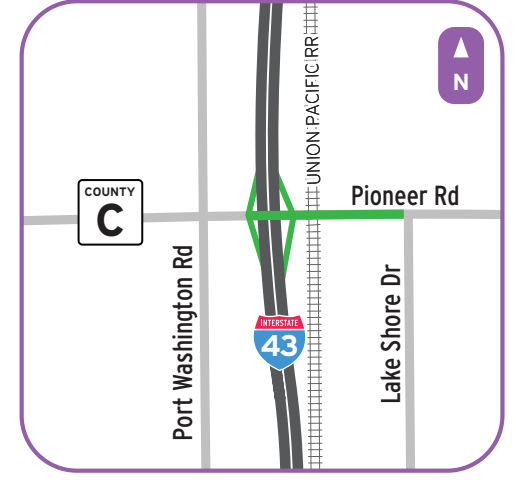
NORTH END SEGMENT:

Between Highland Road and WIS 60 (Washington Street)

Traffic in this segment is scheduled to open to three lanes in each direction in late spring/early summer 2024.



1. The I-43 **northbound exit ramp** to WIS 60 (Washington Street) reopened to traffic in early January 2024.



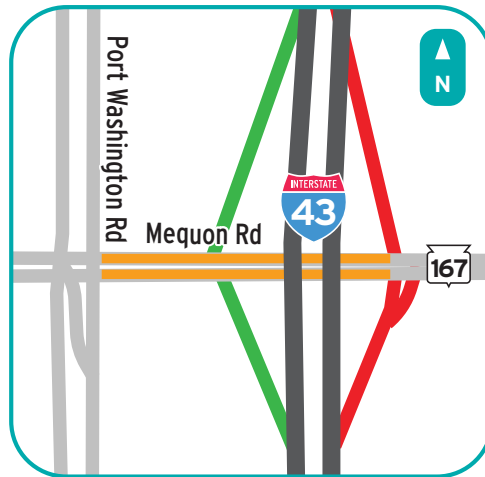
2. The I-43 **northbound ramps** at Pioneer Road (County C), and Pioneer Road over I-43 reopened to traffic in late-December 2023.



3. The I-43 **northbound ramps** at Highland Road reopened to traffic in early-January 2024.

MEQUON ROAD INTERCHANGE SEGMENT:

Between Donges Bay Road and Glen Oakes Lane



4. A **long-term closure** of Mequon Road between Port Washington Road and the Union Pacific Railroad is scheduled to *begin in late spring*. Long-term **lane closures** remain *in place* along Mequon Road between Port Washington Road and the I-43 northbound ramps.

The I-43 **northbound ramps** at Mequon Road are scheduled to remain closed through late summer.

SOUTH END SEGMENT:

Between Bender Road and Brown Deer Road (WIS 100)



5. The I-43 **northbound entrance ramp** at Brown Deer Road is scheduled to *close long-term in late spring*.

The I-43 **southbound ramps** at Brown Deer Road are scheduled to remain closed through summer.

The I-43 **northbound exit ramp** at Brown Deer Road is scheduled to remain closed through fall 2024.



6. The I-43 **southbound ramps** at Good Hope Road are scheduled to close long-term in early summer.

The I-43 **northbound exit ramp** to Good Hope Road reopened to traffic in early April 2024.
