Project Overview

The northbound and southbound bridges crossing the Wisconsin River are being replaced as part of an I-39/90/94 modernization project. To maintain three lanes of traffic in each direction during construction, the work will be completed in stages.

- Summer 2024: Construction begins on the new northbound bridge support piers.
- A new northbound bridge, adjacent to the exisiting northbound bridge will be constructed first.
- When completed in fall 2025, northbound and southbound traffic will be shifted to the new bridge.
- Next, the exiting bridges will be removed and work will begin on the southbound bridge in a similar fashion.
- Fall 2027: The entire bridge project will be completed.

Boater Awareness

During construction, new piers will be construced in the river bed to support the new bridge deck.

- Navigational buoys have been placed in the river to guide boaters through the construction zone.
- This area is no wake and boaters are asked to take extra caution when navigating this area.
- Periodically, the buoys will be relocated in the river as construction progresses.
- The inside diagram shows how to properly navigate this area.


