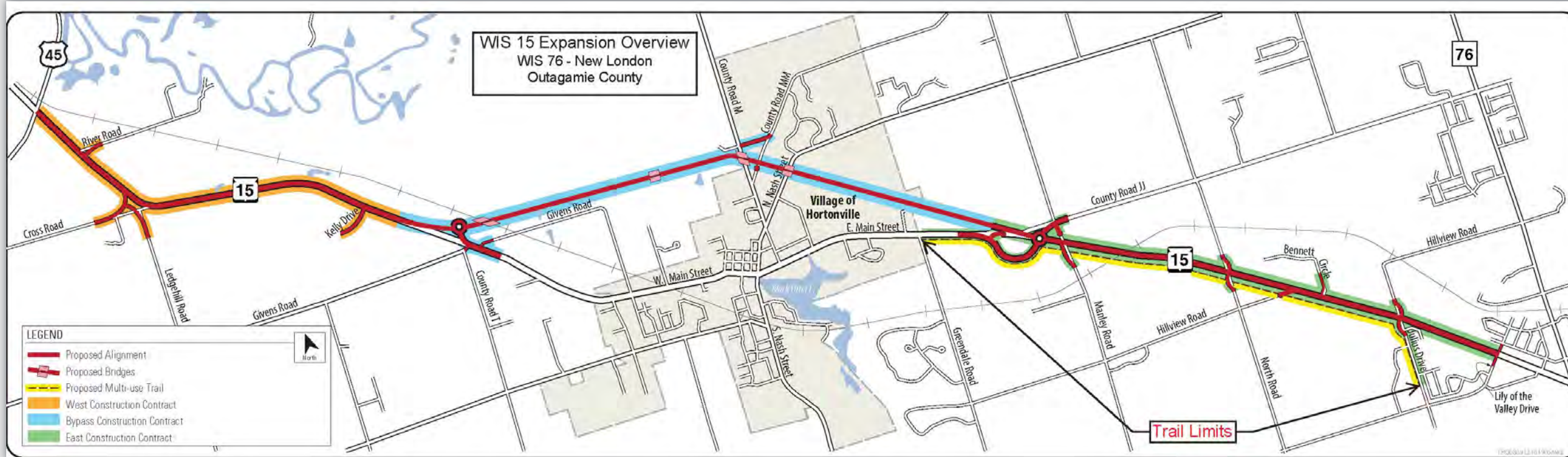

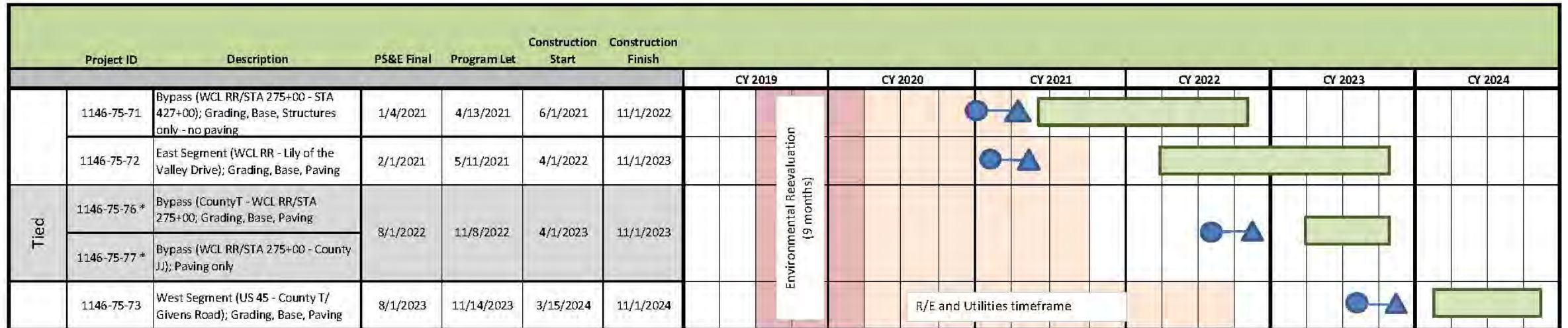
WIS 15 Proposed Access

- Median crossovers
 - East and west segments
 - At major businesses & roughly 2000 feet - 1/2 mile spacing
 - Turn lanes prior to crossovers for safer U-turns
 - Hortonville bypass
 - Spaced further apart (generally > 1 mile)
 - No turn lanes prior to crossovers
- Greater access restrictions on bypass
 - No public road access with overpasses at CN Railroad, County M, Nash Street
 - County MM realigned to meet County M
 - Restricted driveway access

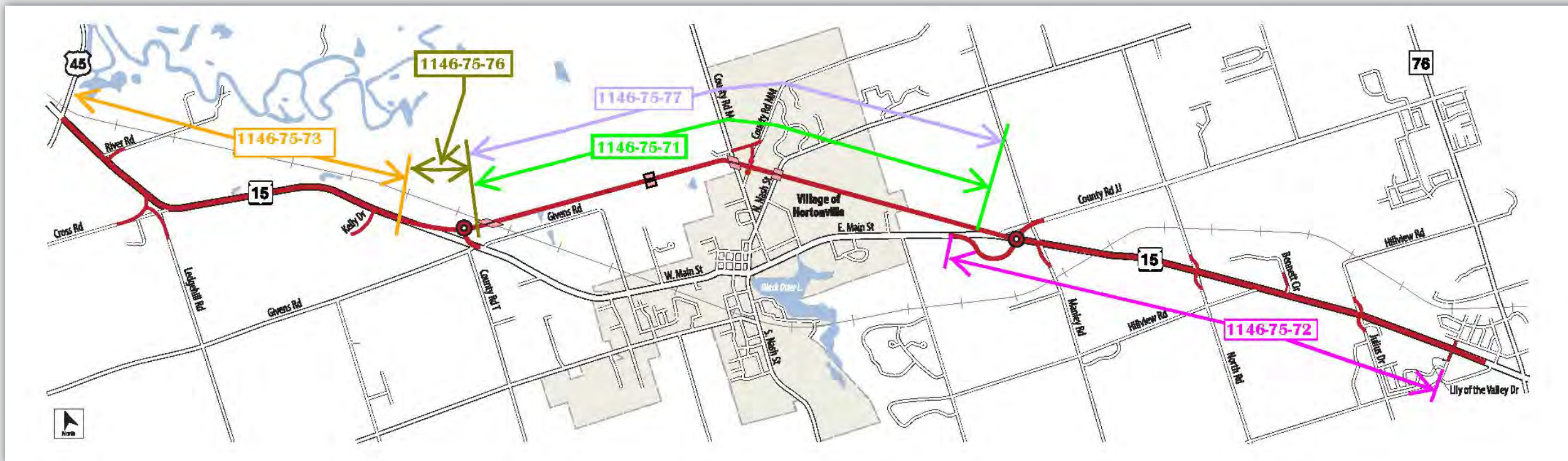
WIS 15 Design Delivery Schedule

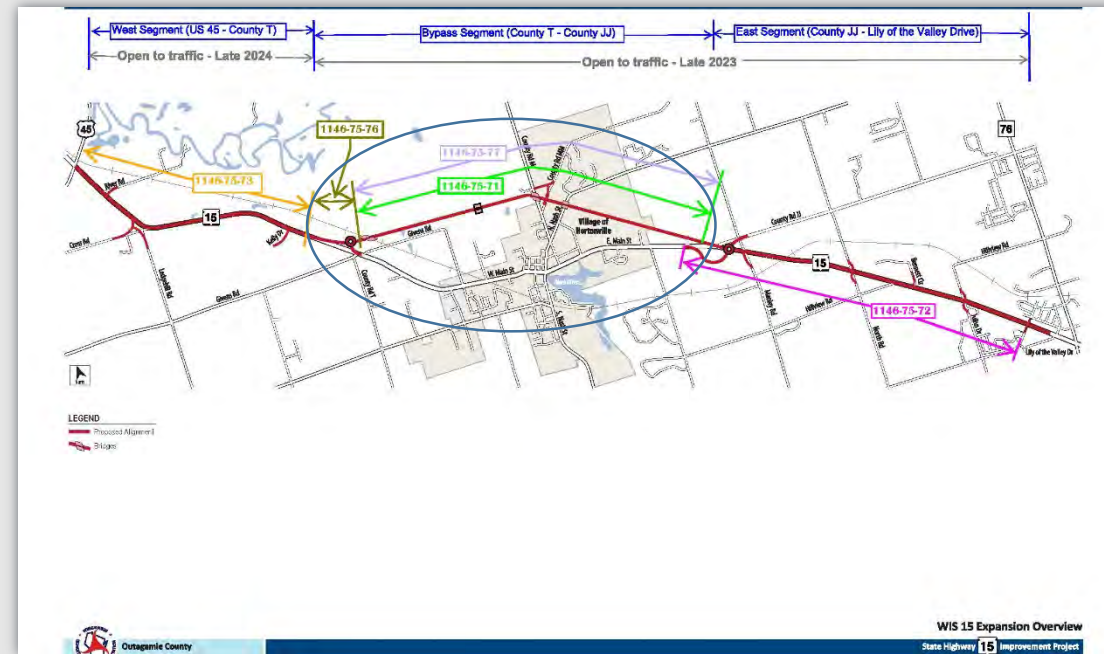

WIS 15 Traffic Impacts - Bypass

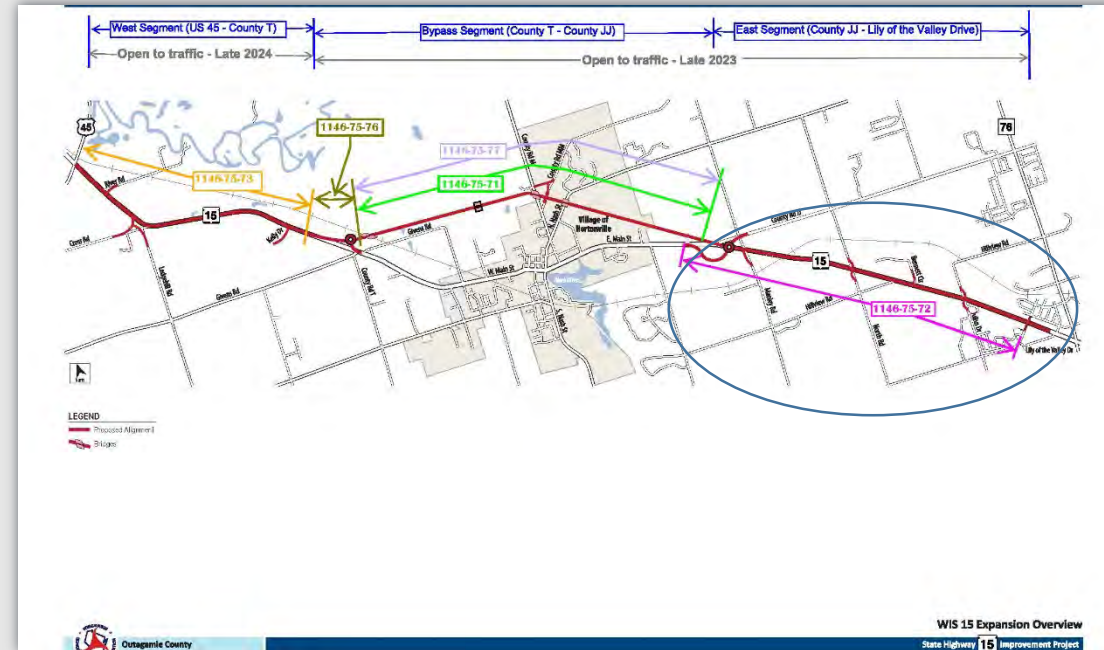
- ID 1146-75-71
 - Work begins June 2021 & complete in Fall 2022
 - Work on new location with little impact to WIS 15
 - Short-term closures of County M & Nash Street
 - 40-calendar day closure of County MM
- ID 1146-75-76/77
 - Work begins in early 2023 & has multiple stages
 - WIS 15 closed for several months near Givens Road - detour follows US 45 to US 10 to I-41
 - Opens in late 2023 in conjunction with east
 - Business, local resident, and emergency access is maintained



WIS 15 Traffic Impacts – East Segment

- ID 1146-75-72

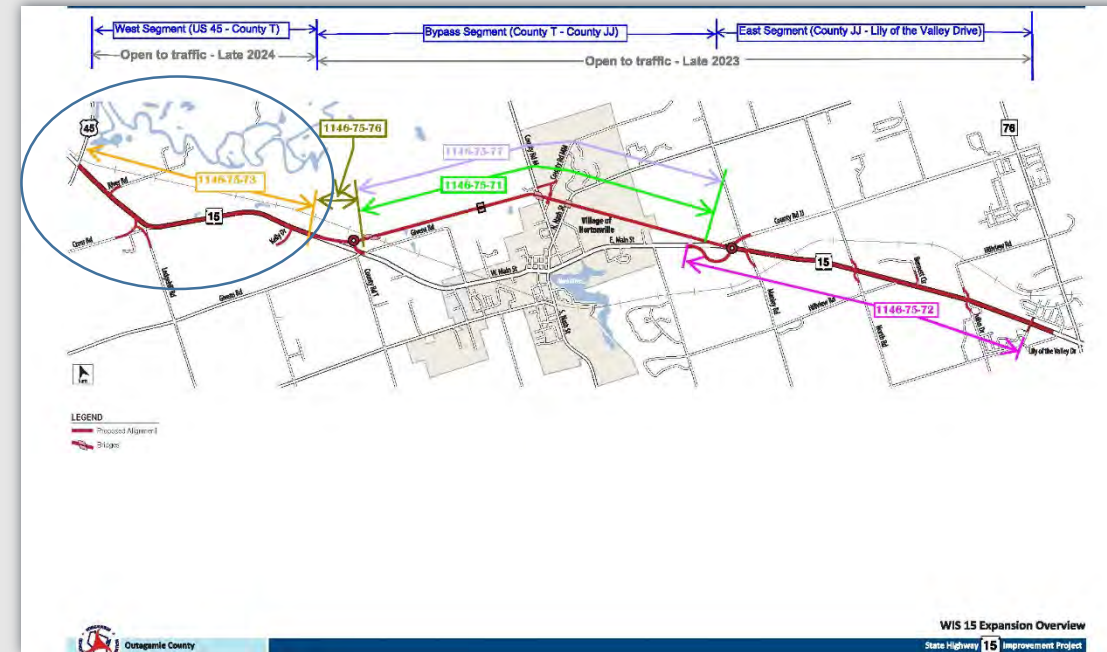
- Work begins early 2022 & complete in Fall 2023
- Completed in multiple stages to keep WIS 15 open for majority of the contract
- WIS 15 closed for about 1 month in late 2022 for reconstruction of at-grade railroad crossing
- Detour follows County JJ to WIS 76
- Side roads closed periodically but consecutive side roads will not be closed at same time
- Opens in late 2023 in conjunction with bypass
- Business, local resident, and emergency access is maintained



WIS 15 Traffic Impacts – West Segment

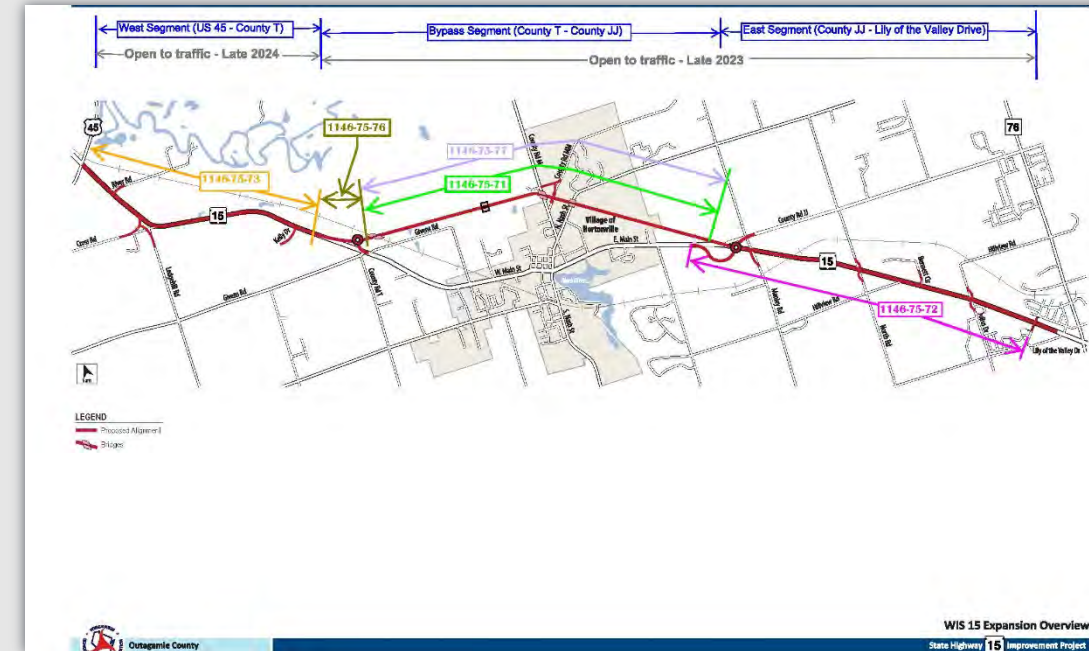
- ID 1146-75-73

- Work begins early 2024 & complete in late 2024
- WIS 15 closed for entire project – detour route follows County T to County TT to US 45
- US 45 also closed for about 1 month for reconstruction of at-grade railroad crossing – detour route follows business US 45 through New London
- Business, local resident, and emergency access is maintained



WIS 15 – Local Construction Impacts

- Local government construction issues
 - Borrow sites
 - Waste sites
 - Haul roads
- Maintenance & repair of haul roads
 - Contractor has authority to use local or county roads for hauling
 - WisDOT will video/review local or county roads with maintaining authority prior to hauling
 - Contractor is responsible to restore haul roads to condition that existed prior to project
